**Forest Service**

We have considered your request regarding potential restrictions on the movement of soil in the area described above. An examination of the Departments records shows that none of the lands involved in the above mentioned proposal, as outlined in the plans submitted are subject to the terms of a Notice relating to Potato Cyst Nematode (PCN) or Potato Wart Disease (PWD) There are therefore no restrictions as far as the Order is concerned on the movement of soil or other material from these lands.

**Fisheries Division**

DARD FISHERIES have no issues or concerns to raise from an aquaculture aspect, but we would like to remind the applicant that; It is an offence under Article 47 of the Fisheries Act (NI) 1966 to cause pollution which is subsequently shown to have a deleterious effect on fish stocks.
